## Sentences

A group of words that make complete sense and expresses a thought is called a sentence.

When we speak, read or write we make use of sentences.

All sentences begin with a capital letter and end with a full stop, question mark or exclamation mark.

We use different types of sentences, which are:

A) Assertive Sentence: A sentence that states or asserts something is called an Assertive Sentence.

An Assertive sentence ends with a full stop.

Example:

The workmen were busy the whole day.



A group of giraffes is called a tower.

Sonia is attending a party tonight.



**B) Interrogative Sentence:** A sentence that asks a question is called an Interrogative sentence. An Interrogative sentence ends with a question mark.

Example:



Was it raining yesterday?

Where are the children going?



Whose bag is this?

**C) Exclamatory:** A sentence that expresses a strong feeling is called an exclamatory sentence. An exclamatory sentence ends with an exclamation mark.

Example:



Wow! Maria, you danced gracefully.

That was a superb performance!



What a dirty old rag this is!
