## Kinds of Sentences

A set of words that make sense and puts forward a thought is called a sentence.

We use sentences when we speak, read or write.

Kindly note that, sentences begin with a capital letter and end with a full stop, question mark or exclamation mark.

Different types of sentences are:

### A) Assertive or Declarative Sentence:

A sentence that asserts or declares something is called an Assertive or Declarative Sentence.

An Assertive or declarative sentence always ends with a full stop. (.)

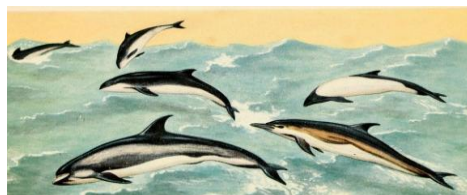
Example:



The books are neatly arranged in the library.



Tina has an excellent collection of rare stamps.



A group of dolphins is called a pod.

## B) Interrogative Sentence:

A sentence that asks a question is called an Interrogative sentence.

An Interrogative sentence ends with a question mark. (?)

Example:



Why is the baby crying?



When will you return back from your vacation?



Have all the cows returned to the shed?

## C) Exclamatory Sentence:

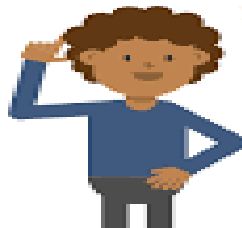
A sentence that portrays the strong emotions of the speaker is called an exclamatory sentence.

An exclamatory sentence ends with an exclamation mark. (!)

Example:



Superb! Your project was excellent.



That's a brilliant idea!



How badly he behaves with the teachers!

## D) Imperative Sentence:

A sentence that expresses a command, order, request or suggestion is called an Imperative sentence.

An imperative sentence ends with a full stop. (.)

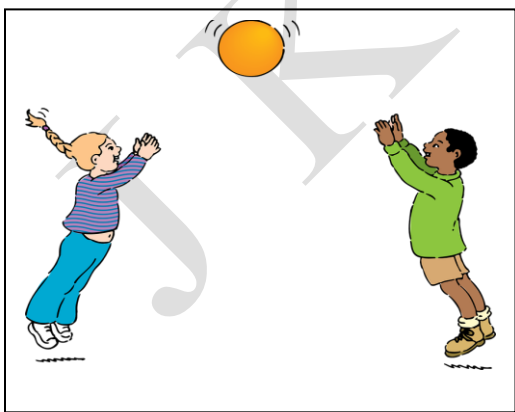
Example:



Sit down quietly.



Please lend me your book.



Let's play a game now.
